## **Tips for Taking Care of Yourself:**

Taking care of yourself, your friends, and your family can help you cope with stress.

- Take breaks from watching, reading, or listening to news stories, including social media. Hearing about the pandemic repeatedly can be upsetting.
- Take care of your body. Take deep breaths, stretch, or meditate. Try to eat healthy, wellbalanced meals, exercise regularly, get plenty of sleep, and avoid alcohol and drugs.
- Make time to unwind. Try to do some other activities you enjoy (i.e. painting, drawing, crafts, home improvement projects, riding a bike, taking a walk).
- Connect with others. Talk with people you trust about your concerns and how you are feeling.
